
OUR MISSION

Improving the quality of life of people with severe multiple disabilities and their families through innovative models.



WHAT IS SEVERE MULTIPLE DISABILITY?

A condition found in children, youth and adults who simultaneously manifest different types of physical, intellectual and/or sensorial disability with a high degree of dependence (more than 75%) in carrying out basic activities of daily life.



THE LKF CENTER, AN INNOVATIVE MODEL

A fully adapted center located in San Juan de Alicante that consists of:

- An assisted living facility for people with severe multiple disabilities.
- A therapy center that offers physiotherapy, aquatic therapy, psychotherapy, speech therapy and occupational therapy.
- A sensory garden with a vegetable garden, an adapted hut for family respites, a boccia court and adapted swings.



The first center built in the Valencian Community with A/A certification.

Our visitors

The LKF Center receives visits from various associations, political personalities, training centers or families interested in learning about our work. Due to the improvement in the public health situation, we have started to receive almost the same number of visits as before the pandemic. We would like to highlight our meeting with the Comisión Permanente del Consejo Social de Sant Joan d' Alacant with whom we've begun to establish synergies.

FAMILY TESTIMONIES

Their words give meaning to all of our work.

Joaquín, father of Virginia, a House-Home resident

There are many miracles in life and I wanted to tell you about ours, involving parents and a beautiful baby girl with a 98% disability. It begins 26 years ago with a much-desired birth that hit us hard when our baby was revealed to have cerebral palsy, but was fortunately alive. We began a series of pilgrimages to all the hospitals in Spain, with a lot of tears and pain, doctors for the three of us, operations and depression. I do not want to bore you or nor demand pity, it is not my goal. Through our fight, we managed to stabilize Virginia and aged prematurely in the process. So much for the painful part. Through word of mouth, the media and colleagues, we learned of an association called the Lukas Foundation and we started to work with it, first through temporary stays and then through family respites.



This is where our MIRACLE began to take shape: suddenly my wife and I started to have time for ourselves! There was life beyond full dedication to our daughter, we could go to the movies (our last visit to a cinema was for a black and white), go for walks, have coffee... while Virginia was in the care of very skilled, professional and committed people. But the miracle was complete when we were given a place in the House-Home. We experienced symptoms of abandonment at the beginning but gained a new life for us, without abandoning Virginia, who now has friends and socializes. We love her madly and can visit every day, and she comes home on weekends and vacations. THANK YOU for what you have done in our lives: a COMPLETE MIRACLE.

The Lukas Foundation for me is synonymous with family, that kind but firm hand that helps you move forward during the most difficult times of your life. I still remember when I entered the foundation to ask for information and to find out if the center was suitable for my son Mikel. Almost three years later, we continue to receive support and affection from all the professionals who work there.

Week after week you show us your tireless vocation and that special sensitivity you have for our children. Sometimes you are a shoulder to cry on, sometimes a source of information, sometimes that active listening that is so beneficial for us and that we need so much. It all depends on the day and the mood.

We – Mikel, Andy and I – will always be grateful for your help. We look forward to continuing to enjoy all the services you offer, the aquatic therapy that Mikel loves so much.

HOUSE-HOME

The Lukas Foundation's assisted living facility is aimed at a very specific segment of the population: young people affected by **Severe Multiple Disabilities** and their families. The House-Home is a pioneering model in the care of severe multiple disabilities, and in circumstances such as those experienced during the pandemic, it has proven to be a safer type of residential resource due to its size and characteristics.







In 2022, we renewed the seal certifying that we have a quality system that complies with ISO 9001:2015.

THIS IS OUR HOUSE-HOME

- Completely adapted assisted living facility
- 6 living spaces that are partially subsidised by the Generalitat Valenciana
- Qualified staff on hand 24 hours a day to carry out various activities on a daily basis
- Humane, personalised and familiar treatment in a large, bright space
- Family participation and active social life while observing safety measures













Virginia joins the House-Home

We are working to ensure that this model is financially recognized by the public authorities and is provided with a subsidy that is large enough to cover the costs of caring for young people with severe multiple disabilities (grade III joint physical and mental disability – greater than 75%).



THERAPY CENTER







Our Therapy Center is open to the general public, offering people with any level of disability or type of dysfunction a wide variety of therapeutic activities.

In September the Therapy Center was accredited as a service for the promotion of personal autonomy, to deliver a service of prevention and promotion.

ADAPTED BICYCLES









"SMILES ON WHEELS" PROJECT 5, we have been working on this 945

Since 2015, we have been working on this project, which enables any person with reduced mobility to use a variety of models of adapted bicycles, mostly electric with a dynamic positioning system that allows the user to sit comfortably while enjoying a new sensation. Users enjoy outdoor adapted leisure activities with family, friends or volunteers, and improve their quality of life thanks to the activity's therapeutic, cognitive and motor benefits.



OUR MODELS

We currently have 16 bicycles in Alicante and 8 in Madrid. Due to intensive use, some models have started to show some wear and tear, which increases the cost of their maintenance, so we are in the process of renewing our fleet, acquiring the new O-Pair model, which is more comfortable and has a better performance.















Thanks to donations from BBVA Asset Management and the Anneke Residence, we added two new O-Pair bikes to our fleet.

In Sant Joan d'Alacant, the young people and children of the House-Home, the Therapy Center and the family respites have enjoyed them all year round. We have six outdoor routes that offer a variety of experiences.

The bicycles in Madrid

In March 2020 we inaugurated our adapted bicycle rental service in Madrid Rio Park, in collaboration with Mobeo. It was suspended at the beginning of the pandemic and we were only able to resume it in September 2021. 2022 was the first year in which our bikes were available on a daily basis at the Matadero.

The results of 2022, together with the announcement of the resumption of the service to entities dedicated to people with disabilities and its inclusion in all the portals of Madrid Destino, mean that we have seen a gradual increase in demand for rentals; this trend accelerated in the first months of 2023.

"Three Wise Men Parade 2022"

At Christmas 2022 we were honored to open the procession of the Three Wise Men Parade in Madrid. Before the start we were accompanied by the mayor, Mr Jose Luis Martinez Almeida, and throughout the ride to Cibeles Square we received exceptional encouragement from spectators, who gave us a continuous ovation as our bicycles passed by, as well as many signs of support that filled us with enthusiasm. We were also interviewed on television and in other media, which allowed us to explain our project and obtain great visibility. So thank you all very much!

SCALING AND REPLICATING THE PROJECT

"Smiles on Wheels" is clearly scalable and replicable in other cities, and our plan is to try to expand it throughout Spain, so that the greatest number of people and entities can make use of the bicycles. By networking with other entities and through the broad dissemination of the project, we have received queries from various localities regarding the possibility of loaning them our bikes, as a first step to identify whether they can acquire one or even replicate the bike rental service in their respective localities.





The "itinerant bicycle"

To make progress on this, we developed the "itinerant bicycle" initiative, which consists of the acquiring an adapted bicycle that we can loan temporarily to organizations dedicated to people with severe disabilities and with high dependency. The initiative is also endowed with an funding to cover the costs of the bicycle's maintenance and shipping to and from various locations in Spain.





At the end of 2022, the Bing Crosby Foundation granted us €15,000 for this project, which we have now launched: we have ordered the O-pair adapted bicycle and started the calendar of loans throughout Spain in 2023.

Bicycle loan to the También Foundation

We have loaned a Duet adapted bicycle to the También Foundation, which is now available at their facility in Juan Carlos I Park in Madrid to be enjoyed by young people and children with severe multiple disabilities.

FAMILY SUPPORT

Thanks to the improvement of the public health situation, we have gradually resumed our family support programs, such as family respites and awareness-raising campaigns. We will resume the temporary stays in 2023.

Family information and assistance service

Our information service has continued to offer all people with disabilities and their families information, support and advice on the social resources that are available to them. Of the 52 users who requested information, 33 did so by telephone and 19 in person.

WE ARE SUSTAINABLE





We continue to support all matters related to sustainability and the design and construction of inclusive and integration parks.

In 2018, we became the first to own an adapted electric vehicle in Spain, which allows our kids to go out together with their caregivers when necessary. Our transportation model is always green because we also use our adapted bicycles.





The LKF Center uses solar collectors to heat our water and photovoltaic panels to generate electricity, and also has a rainwater harvesting and water reuse system.

Our garden and integration park at the LKF Center allows families to enjoy adapted play, the experience of inclusive leisure in the sensory garden and the accessible vegetable garden area.





Our Manual of Construction and Equipment of Integration Playgrounds remains a reference point in Madrid City Council's Accessibility Manual for urbanized public spaces. We have collaborated in the construction of two adapted playgrounds: the integration playground at CEIP Escuelas Bosque in Madrid and the public playground in the town of Busot, Alicante.

We remain committed, together with other entities, to the Foundations for the Climate Pact.





On 2 September 2014 we were granted the Building Energy Efficiency Certification, becoming the first A/A-rated building in the Valencian Community, under the supervision of a control entity: Atisae.

The financial losses correspond to €102,432.15 due to a reduction in investments, €21,956.68 for the sale of an asset and €298.16 for custody rights expenses, amid a complex macroeconomic context in 2022.

TRANSPARENCY

Transparency is a fundamental value for us, so since 2011, our accounts are audited and can be consulted on our website. Since 2013, we voluntarily submit to the analysis of the Lealtad Foundation and therefore have the Accredited NGO seal.



NEXT CHALLENGES

MAIN CHALLENGE FOR THE FOUNDATION

To ensure that severe multiple disability (SMD) is recognized by public bodies, state confederations of people with disabilities and by society in general as a distinct category within the highest degree of disability. We also want to ensure that it is endowed both financially and in terms of assistance with sufficient resources to meet the specific needs of young people who suffer from severe physical and mental disabilities.

SPECIFIC CHALLENGES FOR 2023

- Consolidate the contacts/tasks that lead the housing model that the foundation has in Sant Joan de Alicante to be replicated in another city.
- To obtain a statistical study that defines the real dimension of the group of people affected by SMD in our country, an essential tool to establish their claim.
- Extend the opening hours of the Therapy Center to provide assistance to a greater number of families.
- Adapt the garden of the LKF Center to increase the number of activities held there by acquiring recreational-therapeutic games.
- To scale up the "Smiles on Wheels" project in other cities throughout Spain, in order to significantly increase the number of municipalities and organizations dedicated to people with disabilities that use the adapted bicycles.
